Like the city it supports, Downtown Inc has been making things happen and moving things forward as long as it's been in existence. Never did we prove that competitive edge more than in 2018, when we took the forward-looking step of affiliating with the York County Economic Alliance.

By aligning ourselves with an economic powerhouse – while maintaining our own team, identity and accessible downtown location – we instantly increased our capacity without diminishing our impact.

As this affiliation grows over time, our main objective remains to increase economic growth across York County and within Downtown York in order to create a sustained prosperity for all residents.

This affiliation expanded Downtown Inc's tools and added substantial value for Downtown York businesses. The YCEA's 20-person team also provides increased marketing and event support, economic development assistance, project financing capabilities and access to new grant opportunities to help small businesses grow.

It marked a necessary evolution for an organization that doesn't just view something revolutionary as part of its past. And there were plenty more forward-looking moments for Downtown Inc in 2018.

We launched the new Historically Edgy Downtown York destination brand – which has already garnered statewide acclaim – to spotlight our city as the tourism asset it is.

We worked with community partners to light the façades of the former Northwestern Mutual Building and the Rupp Building, highlighting two striking buildings in the heart of our downtown and setting the stage for another major lighting project – that of the York County Administrative Center's historic domes.

We grew First Friday on Continental Square and threw a party for more than 400 of our friends at the former Pewterex Foundry – an ambitious undertaking for sure.

And we gave our giant scissors a workout, cutting the ribbon on more than 30 new or expanded businesses. Then we stood by them providing technical assistance, marketing services, professional workshops and more.

Around us, Downtown York grew.

Modern new residential units came online, attracting young professionals and empty nesters alike. The York County Heritage Rail Trail's Northern Extension marched ahead, signaling that one of the region's premier recreational amenities will soon be complete.

And major projects, like the Yorktowne Hotel renovations and Codorus Creek beautification initiatives, moved ahead with the potential to transform our downtown like never before.

Downtown Inc has been honored to be part of the growth. And it's even more satisfying now that we're together for the better with our friends at the York County Economic Alliance.

In 2018, Downtown Inc...

- Launched strategic affiliation with the York County Economic Alliance to build our capacity and leverage new resources for downtown businesses.
- Reinvigorated the Business Series workshops to offer free professional development covering social media, employment law, customer service and more.
- Facilitated 33 ribbon cuttings for new or expanded businesses in Downtown York.
- Supported 100+ current and prospective businesses.



PLACEMAKING

Placemaking is the creation of safe, inviting and friendly public spaces that promote health, happiness and well-being. We work toward this goal by taking on projects such as creating efficient way-finding, parking and transit for all modes of transportation; addressing beautification, infrastructure, gateways, walkability, public spaces and the physical environment.

In 2018, Downtown Inc ...

- Removed nearly 14 tons of trash and recycling from our downtown's sidewalks.
- Partnered with the York County Community Foundation and ASCOM to install 12 new lights and illuminate the façade of the Northwestern Mutual Building at 1 S. George St.
- Partnered with the York County Community Foundation, RSDC, ASCOM, and private partners to install lights and illuminate the facades of the Rupp Building, 1 W. Market St.
- Partnered with Kinsley Construction to replace 7 deteriorated trench drain covers in a highly trafficked section of the downtown, eliminating a dangerous tripping hazards to pedestrians.
- Worked with the General Authority and Hively Landscaping to plant a vibrant installation in the King Street Garage planter basins.
- Continued our partnership with the Garden Club of York to fill over 90 planters throughout the downtown with flowers.
- Continued our partnership with the City of York and LifePath Christian Ministries to fill Cherry Lane, Foundry Park and downtown street tree wells with over 10 tons of mulch.
- Supported the Rail Trail Authority and City of York in progressing the final construction of the Heritage Rail Trail, as we work to connect the southern portion of the trail north to John Rudy County Park.
- Supported the City of York in its expansion of bicycle infrastructure and amenities leading to the designation of Silver Bicycle Friendly Community from the League of American Bicyclists – the only other silver designated community in the state is Philadelphia!
- Conducted a downtown lighting audit, tracking and reporting poorly and non-functioning lights throughout the downtown to the City of York and Met-Ed.
- Worked with Keep PA Beautiful, Philip Morris USA, and the City of York to install 18 cigarette litter receptacles to start a new cigarette litter prevention program in Downtown York.

PROMOTION

Effective communications and programming are paramount to ensuring that downtown businesses enjoy a consistent flow of customers. Downtown Inc hosts special events, markets Downtown York and drives a branding project that will reshape the perception of York for years to come.

In 2018, Downtown Inc...

- Launched new Historically Edgy destination brand to better promote Downtown York's tourism amenities.
- Secured \$100,000 in York County tourism grant funds to support brand launch and development.
- Welcomed 60,000+ attendees at Downtown Inc events.
- Redesigned and re-launched Downtown York magazine with focus on lifestyle content and storytelling.
- Distributed 30,000 copies of the Downtown York Magazine across the region, where each edition was read by more than 100,000 people.
- Delivered Downtown news and updates to 20,000+ social media followers.
- Facilitated co-op advertising that featured more than 20 Downtown York partners.
- Hosted Small Business Saturday press conference to shine light on important shopping week for downtown merchants.
- Launched new travel writer hosting program, which drew 3 regional writers to Downtown York in 2018.
- Organized and promoted Downtown Inc events that had an economic impact of more than \$1 million in our community, according to figures by Americans for the Arts.
- Expanded First Friday entertainment to Continental Square from May through November to better connect all three Downtown York districts.
- Hung 1,270 feet of greens and 302 bows on 151 light posts during Hanging of the Greens.

Downtown Inc works toward this goal by taking on projects such as environmental design, addressing vagrancy and nuisance issues, community policing, data collection and monitoring.

In 2018, Downtown Inc...

- Worked with Better York to deploy an additional 155 hours of law enforcement in the downtown from June to November on weekend evenings.
- Held a community safety workshop for downtown merchants and businesses to facilitate ongoing dialogue between business owners and the City Police Department.
- Worked with the Women's Giving Circle, YMCA and private property owners to expand our security camera program and install 2 security cameras around Foundry Park.
